

**SCHEDULE A – Incontinence Supplies Catalogue Listing**

As per clause 2(b) of this Agreement, the Vendor, by signing or by placing its signature underneath a Benefit Group listed in Schedule A, hereby agrees to provide the Catalogue Items that fall under that particular Benefit Group, and shall abide by the specific conditions that exist for provision of Catalogue Items under that Benefit Group as described in Schedule A, and shall not provide any Catalogue Items for Benefit Groups that are not agreed to in Schedule A.

**Conditions for the Benefit Group Incontinence Supplies (Diapers)**

**Stock:** Stock on site a minimum of two (2) different approved manufacturers' product lines that meet AADL's generic descriptions and absorbency standards.

**Claims:** Submit a minimum of twelve (12) claims per Fiscal Year.

**Education Requirement:** A minimum of one (1) staff member who completed a training course from a diaper manufacturer such as Tena, Attends every five (5) years.

		<p>All assessments, interventions and evaluations are completed prior to determining or supplying a client with AADL product.</p> <p>Clients are to be authorized: quantities of products based on their needs; if a combination of products is needed rationale of intended use will be clearly documented on the authorization or change form; the size of diaper authorized will be based on the client's hip measurement at the trochanter.</p> <p>Clients are eligible for a maximum combination of 400 every two months; M 243 is included in the combination maximum.</p> <p>Pediatric authorizations/ change forms submissions need to include AADL's pediatric assessment tool and the intake record after interventions have been implemented.</p> <p>Adult authorizations/ change forms need to include AADL's incontinence summary form.</p> <p>Products provided must have re-usable fasteners, soft woven material that promotes skin integrity, wetness indicator that signals appropriate changes, each product must meet minimal absorbency criteria.</p> <p>There are no exceptions and AADL is not able to provide: feel wet (training) diapers, "swimmers", feminine hygiene products or any other product that does not meet generic descriptions and absorbency standards.</p> <p>Clients are encourage to order only quantities that they need for that particular two months period and are aware that vendors are not able to implement automatic deliveries of product.</p>

M243	60/2 mo	<b><u>Disposable Non- Plastic Back Booster Liners</u></b> <b>Minimal 250 ml absorbency at</b> target area consisting of polymer material of approximate 31/2" x 12" dimensions; this benefit is intended to provide caregiver respite as it increases the client's current product absorbency of the full brief, diaper or M 240; maximum quantities are 60 every two months with a combination of maximum of other products of 400 every two months. If a client requires more than 60 every two months despite trailing more absorbent products and interventions, then prior approval needs to be obtained from AADL's program manager.	\$0.80
M263	2/2 mo	<b><u>Reusable Washable Underpads- minimal size of 43 x 51 cm.</u></b> These supplies are for clients with a severe incontinence problem and are requiring other incontinence products. Only exception – palliative clients	\$14.36
