

Seniors Supportive Housing Incentive Program (SSHIP)

Approved Projects

Grande Spirit Foundation - Wild Rose Manor (Phase I), Grande Prairie

The SSHIP program will provide the management body with a one-time capital grant of \$552,500 or 25 per cent of their capital costs for a 24-unit new addition to the existing lodge. Unlike traditional lodge units, these new units include more self-contained housing features such as kitchen facilities. The project also includes modifications to the existing lodge that will accommodate aging in place. The Foundation was also approved for \$100,000 in funding from the Healthy Aging Partnerships Initiative through the Mistahia Regional Health Authority.

Newthorad Seniors Housing Foundation - Thorhild Lodge, Thorhild

A SSHIP grant of \$370,610 will allow the management body to complete a 14-unit supportive housing addition to the existing lodge. The project includes plans to move four units from Newbrook and add them to the Thorhild Lodge. A wellness centre will also be constructed in conjunction with the supportive housing addition.

Heart River Housing - Villa Beausejour, Falher

With the SSHIP grant of \$150,000, Heart River Housing management body will convert 20 traditional lodge units to supportive housing units that will accommodate aging in place.

North Peace Foundation - Harvest Lodge, Fairview

The SSHIP program will provide a one-time capital grant of \$1,250,000 or 25 per cent of the capital costs to the management body for a new 65-unit facility. The Foundation was also approved for \$120,000 in funding from the Healthy Aging Partnerships Initiative through the Mistahia Regional Health Authority.

Barrhead & District Social Housing Association - Barrhead

The SSHIP program will provide the management body with a one-time capital grant of \$1,000,000 or 25 per cent of their capital costs for a new 40-unit project that will be constructed adjacent to the existing lodge. Project plans include features that will make the lodge 25 per cent more energy efficient than what's expected by the Model National Energy Code and may entitle the management body to a national Commercial Building Incentive Program grant.

Lakeland Lodge & Housing Foundation - Bonny Lodge, Bonnyville

A SSHIP grant of \$137,750 will allow the management body to build an 8-unit addition onto the existing lodge, designed for aging in place. This project will provide housing to allow seniors stay in the community.

La Société des Manoir St. Joachim/Thomas - Edmonton

The SSHIP program will provide a one-time capital grant of \$1,200,000 to the management body toward the construction of a new 100-unit project that proposes to combine long-term care and supportive housing units.

Beit Horim - Our Parent's Home, Edmonton

The SSHIP program will provide a one-time capital grant of \$575,000 or 22 per cent of the capital costs to the private non-profit organization for a new 31-unit project targeted to the Jewish community.

Shepherd's Care Foundation - Millwoods Manor, Edmonton

Through the SSHIP program, the private non-profit organization will receive a one-time capital grant of \$81,875 or 25 per cent of the capital costs to convert an existing 30-unit self-contained project to allow aging in place.

Salvation Army - Grace Manor, Edmonton

The SSHIP program will provide a one-time capital grant of \$1,000,000 or 11 per cent of the capital costs to the private non-profit organization for a new 100-unit project that will replace an aging 41-unit facility. The project plans feature a unique design that divides the building into six 'pods' that join into a central streetscape-like area.

Seniors Homes & Community Housing - Peace Hills Lodge, Wetaskiwin

The SSHIP program will provide a one-time capital grant of \$361,675 or 25 per cent of the capital costs to the management body toward a 20-unit addition to the existing lodge that includes self-contained housing features such as kitchen facilities. The project will also link the lodge to other existing self-contained housing units.

Good Samaritan Society - Evansburg

Through the SSHIP program, the private non-profit organization will receive a one-time capital grant of \$500,000 or 23 per cent of the capital costs for a new 30-unit project that will replace the existing lodge. The project is the combined effort of the Good Samaritan Society, the Evergreens Foundation and the Westview Regional Health Authority.

Piper Creek Foundation - Pines Lodge, Red Deer

A SSHIP grant of \$250,000 will allow the management body to complete a 20-unit addition to the existing lodge. The project is the combined effort of the David Thompson Regional Health Authority, Piper Creek Foundation, Twilight Homes Foundation, Alberta Council on Aging and the Golden Circle.

County of Stettler Housing Authority - Stettler

Through the SSHIP program, the management body will receive a one-time capital grant of \$398,585 or 25 per cent of the capital costs of converting 64 existing self-contained units to supportive housing units that will feature dining facilities, health and personal care services. The community found the existing facility experienced chronic vacancies while there was a waiting list for the lodge. The project will help to alleviate this discrepancy and accommodate aging in place.

Salvation Army - Jackson Willan Seniors Residence, Calgary

The SSHIP program will provide a one-time capital grant of \$1,778,005 or 19 per cent of the capital costs to the non-profit organization for a new 100-unit project that will replace an existing 18-unit facility. The design of this project is similar to the Grace Manor project in Edmonton.

Foothills Foundation - Sandstone Lodge, Okotoks

A SSHIP grant of \$244,000 will allow the management body to complete a 10-unit addition and modifications to the existing lodge that will accommodate aging in place. The Foundation was also approved for \$244,000 in funding from the Healthy Aging Partnerships Initiative through the Headwaters Regional Health Authority.

Porcupine Hills Foundation - Porcupine Hills Lodge, Claresholm

With the SSHIP grant of \$150,000, the management body will add eight manufactured units that will be located adjacent to the existing lodge. These will be two-bedroom units and include self-contained housing features such as kitchen facilities that will allow couples to age in place. The Foundation was also approved for \$150,000 in funding from the Healthy Aging Partnerships Initiative through the Headwaters Regional Health Authority.
